SCOUTING HOLY CROSS

- Holy Cross opened its 2017-2018 campaign with an 84-56 victory over UMass Lowell on Sunday.
- The Crusaders finished their 2016-2017 campaign with an overall record of 8-22, and a 6-12 mark in the Patriot League.
- Holy Cross was eliminated by Lafayette in the first round of the Patriot League Tournament at the Hart Center at the Luth Athletic Complex in Worcester.
- The Crusaders had two student-athletes (Infiniti Thomas-Waheed and Lauren Manis) complete the year averaging double-digit points per game.
- Lauren Manis was named the 2016-2017 Patriot League Rookie of the Year, while Katie Doherty earned Academic All-Patriot League honors.

SERIES QUICK HITS

- The Crusaders are 7-0 all-time against the Red Foxes.
- Holy Cross last met the Red Foxes during the 2017-2018 season, when the Crusaders won 50-46 in Worcester.
- In the last meeting between these two teams, Lauren Manis led the Crusaders with 12 points and recorded a double-double with 10 rebounds. Infiniti Thomas-Waheed led Holy Cross with 14 rebounds.
- In games played in Poughkeepsie, Holy Cross leads the all-time series 2-0.

LAST TIME OUT

• The Holy Cross women's basketball team downed UMass Lowell for their first win of the season by a 84-56 margin in their first regular season game of the 2017-18 season.

• Lauren Manis led the Crusaders with 21 points, had three assists and four rebounds.

• Infiniti Thomas-Waheed added a 19 point effort with four rebounds and one steal.

• Holy Cross hit 52.4 percent of its field goal attempts, including a 62.5 field goal percentage in the second and third quarters.

• The Crusaders made 11 of 27 three-pointers for a 40.7 percentage on the game.

• Holy Cross forced Lowell to commit 22 turnovers and held its largest lead of the game of 38 points in the fourth quarter.

• Tricia Byrne added a 13 point outing, with four rebounds and two assists.

• Kathryn Pedi shot 3-5 from beyond the arc and led the team with two steals.

SCOUTING REPORT ON MARIST

• Marist opened its 2017-2018 season with a 77-70 loss to Navy on Friday night in Poughkeepsie, N.Y.

• The Red Foxes went 15-17 overall last season with an 11-9 record in MAAC play. They were eliminated in their second game of the MAAC Tournament against Fairfield, 61-44.

• Rebekah Hand led the Red Foxes with 16 points and registered seven rebounds.

• Maura Fitzpatrick led Marist with 10 rebounds, and added five points in the loss.

• Head coach Brian Giorgis is entering his 16th season with the Red Foxes in 2017-2018.

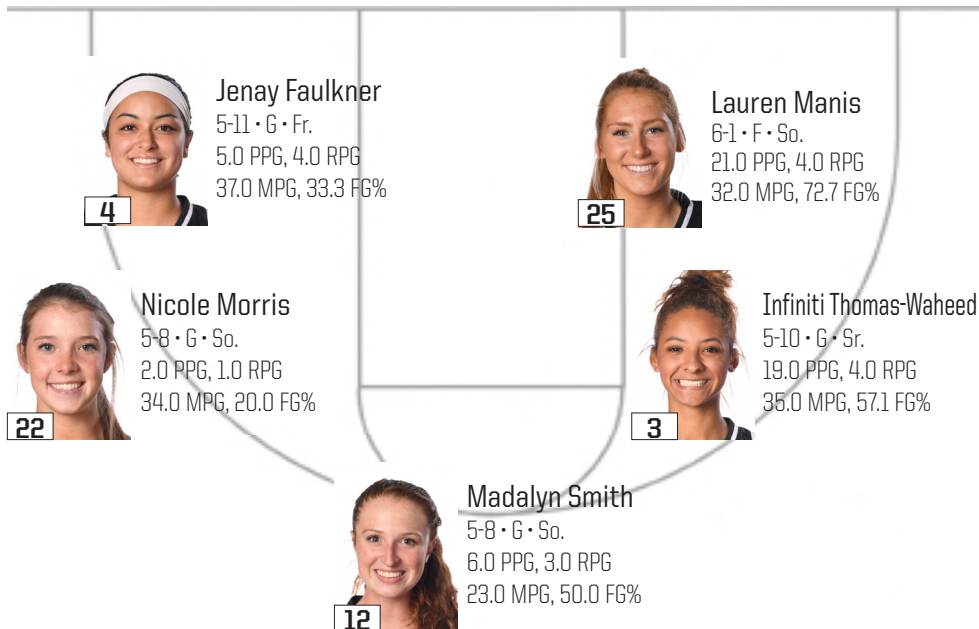

CRUSADERS TABBED SIXTH IN PATRIOT LEAGUE PRESEASON POLL

- The Holy Cross women's basketball team was selected to finish sixth in the Patriot League preseason poll, as voted on by the league's head coaches and media relations directors.
- Army West Point and defending Patriot League champion Bucknell were both selected as the preseason favorites in the conference's preseason poll. Both programs received 140 points in the voting process along with seven first-place votes.
- American was selected third in the poll, receiving 134 points in the voting process and five first-place votes.
- Coming in fourth was Navy with 119 points and one first-place vote, while Boston University was selected fifth with 91 points.
- Rounding out the rest of the preseason poll were Lehigh (seventh, 64 points), Colgate (eighth, 55 points), Loyola (Md.) (ninth, 54 points) and Lafayette (10th, 22 points).

MAN, OH MANIS

- Sophomore Lauren Manis, who was named the Patriot League's Rookie of the Year and Second Team All-Patriot League last year, ranked second on the team with 13.3 points per game while

leading the squad with 7.6 rebounds per game.

- She also led the Crusaders with 34 blocks on the year, and added 48 steals with 34 assists on the year.
- She scored in double digits 24 times on the year, while posting 20 or more points on four occasions.
- Manis also posted double-digit rebounds 10 times and notched eight double doubles.
- In the exhibition victory over Assumption Manis posted a double-double with 22 points and 12 rebounds.

TO INFINITI AND BEYOND

- Senior Infiniti Thomas-Waheed will serve as a team captain for the Crusaders during the 2017-2018 season.
- Last season, she led the Crusaders with 13.9 points per game, while ranking second on the team with 5.6 rebounds per game.
- Thomas-Waheed also totaled 38 steals and 23 blocks on the year while adding 49 assists.
- She appeared in 23 games on the year before missing part of the season due to injury. She was named Second Team All-Patriot League and All-Defensive team in 2015-2016.

DOHERTY READY TO CONTINUE HER IMPACT

- Senior Katie Doherty returns to serve as a team captain for the second-straight year in the 2017-2018 season.
- Doherty was an Academic All-Patriot League selection in 2016-2017.
- Last year Doherty posted 7.4 points per game while ranking second on the team with 59 assists.
- She also posted 41 steals on the year while averaging 3.6 rebounds per game.
- Doherty was named to the Academic All-Patriot League team the each of the past two seasons, and was also named to the All-Rookie team as a freshman.

BYRNE BABY, BYRNE

- Senior Tricia Byrne also returns as a second-year captain for Holy Cross in 2017-2018.
- Last year she averaged 8.6 points per game while leading the Crusaders with 90 assists on the year.
- Byrne also led the team in steals, totaling 56 for the season.

SOPHOMORES AIMING FOR NEW HEIGHTS

- In additions to returning PL Rookie of the Year Lauren Manis, the Crusaders also welcome back four talented sophomores in Madalyn Smith, Kathryn Pedi, Nicole Morris and Megan Swords; who will look to have a big impact this season.
- Smith posted 132 points on the season last year, averaging 21.4 minutes per game at guard. She also added 58 assists to rank third on the Crusaders, and posted 16 steals.
- Pedi and Morris will both look to have an impact at guard as well this year. Pedi added 38 points on the season in 2016-2017, while Morris posted 34 points and 21 assists.
- Swords will also return to the lineup after missing part of the season due to an injury. She totaled 23 points and added 36 rebounds.

CRUSADERS WELCOME THREE FRESHMEN

- Holy Cross welcomes three freshmen to its squad for the 2017-2018 campaign.
- This year's freshman class includes

Jenay Faulkner, Mia Mazza and Shan-none Murphy.

- Faulkner was a four-year varsity basketball player at Greencastle-Antrim, where she finished her high school career as the school's all-time leading scorer, and set a pair of school records for single-game three pointers (9) and points in a single game (38).
- Mazza was a four-year varsity starter at St. Francis, where she helped lead her team to its first state regional championship since 2003.
- Murphy competed four years on the varsity basketball team at Watertown, where she was named Boston Herald All-Scholastic, Boston Globe All-Scholastic, Middlesex League Most Valuable Player and earned Middlesex League All-Star honors all four years.

CRUSADERS AIM FOR BANNER 12

- This year, Holy Cross will be looking to capture its 12th Patriot League Championship. The 11 conference title victories are the most in the history of the Patriot League.
- The Crusaders have also been to a Patriot League-best 18 championship games, including three straight trips in 2011-2012, 2012-2013 and 2013-2014.
- The last Patriot League championship for Holy Cross came during the 2007 season, when it defeated American 56-48 at the Hart Center.

HOME SWEET HOME

- Now in its 42nd campaign, the Holy Cross women's basketball team has enjoyed great success in home games played at the Hart Center at the Luth Athletic Complex, as it is 381-149 (.721) all-time since the beginning of the program in 1974-1975.
- The Crusaders have posted winning records at the Hart Center in three of their last four seasons. In 2012-2013, Holy Cross was 9-6, while in 2013-2014 it was 10-5. Last season, Holy Cross posted a 9-5 record at home, and went 6-3 in Patriot League games played at the Hart Center.
- The Crusaders played their 500th game at the Hart Center on, Feb. 18, 2015, when they defeated Lafayette, 59-53.

BILL GIBBONS

Head Coach • 33rd Season • Clark, 1981

Bill Gibbons is in his 33rd season at the helm of the Holy Cross women's basketball program in 2016-2017, and his 36th season as part of the Holy Cross athletic department. He is the winningest coach in the history of the program, leading the Crusaders to an overall mark of 581-361 in his first 31 years. On Dec. 3, 2011, Gibbons earned his 500th victory as Holy Cross' head coach, becoming the 24th active Division I coach to reach 500 wins. He crossed the 550-win plateau on Feb. 19, 2014.

Gibbons was the recipient of the prestigious Paul N. Johnson Award, given to a member of the Worcester community who has greatly contributed to Worcester area basketball. With his service, the name Gibbons has become a fixture in the realm of women's basketball. He has led the Crusaders to 12 conference titles, including 11 Patriot League Championships in his career as head coach. He has also made 13 postseason appearances (11 NCAA Tournaments, one WNIT and one WBI) in his 30 years. With seventeen 20-win seasons under his belt, Gibbons has cemented himself and the women's basketball program as one of the best in the East.

The sixth coach of the women's program at Holy Cross, Gibbons has enjoyed the longest tenure in the position. He has led the Holy Cross women's basketball program to more victories than any other coach, and is the winningest coach in Holy Cross basketball history. With his 358th victory, he surpassed George Blaney (357 wins as head coach of the Holy Cross men's basketball program), who had hired him to be his assistant coach in 1981. Now with more than 550 wins under his belt, Gibbons is the second-winningest coach in Holy Cross Athletics history, behind legendary baseball coach Jack Barry, who totaled 616 wins from 1921-1960.

In 2007, Gibbons was named the assistant women's basketball coach for Team USA, competing in the Pan American Games in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. During the five-day basketball tournament made up of eight international basketball teams, Gibbons' team took home the gold medal, winning the championship game on July 24 over Brazil in front of 15,000 fans.

In 2006, Gibbons was named as a Russell Athletic / WBCA Victory Club Award recipient. The Russell Athletic / WBCA Victory Club Award is presented to each WBCA member head coach who achieves career wins of 200, 300, 400 and 500. Gibbons made his way onto the prestigious list with a 70-53 win over Army on January 12, 2005. Entering the 2013-2014 season, Gibbons ranks in the top-25 on the list of winningest active Division I coaches.

SEVENTEEN 20-WIN SEASONS

Gibbons has led the Crusaders to more victories than any other coach in Holy Cross history during his 29-year tenure. He has won 20 or more games in 11 of the last 20 seasons and in 17 seasons overall. His 17 20-win seasons are tied for the 29th most by a Division I coach in NCAA history. For his career, Gibbons has averaged 18.9 wins per year. In his rookie campaign, Gibbons led his squad to an impressive 21-7 overall record and a third place finish in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference. The 1986-1987 Crusaders finished with a 19-10 overall mark and placed second in the MAAC. In 1987-1988, Holy Cross upped its ledger to 21-8 and took second place conference honors. Gibbons' level of success reached new heights with a MAAC Tournament title and an NCAA Tournament appearance in 1988-1989. In addition, the Crusaders finished the season 21-10 overall and 10-2 in the MAAC.

SUCCESS IN THE PATRIOT LEAGUE

The 1990-1991 campaign was a monumental season for Gibbons. Voted Patriot League Coach of the Year by his peers, he led the Crusaders to a 12-0 conference record and to the regular season and postseason league championships. Under his care and guidance, Holy Cross finished 25-6, setting a school record for victories. In addition, the squad earned an at-large invitation to the NCAA Tournament, upsetting Maryland, 81-74, at the Hart Center for the program's first-ever NCAA Tournament victory.

Gibbons directed the 1992-1993 Crusaders to a 22-7 overall mark and a Patriot League regular season title. His 1994-1995 and 1995-1996 squads also captured Patriot League championships, giving Holy Cross three titles in a span of four years. Gibbons earned his 200th career win on March 5, 1995, when the Crusaders upended Bucknell, 62-39 in the semifinals of the Patriot League Tournament.

In 1996-1997, Gibbons guided his squad to a 23-4 mark, matching the best winning percentage in school history. With a 12-0 mark in Patriot League play, Holy Cross became just the second team in league history to compile a perfect regular season record. For his efforts, Gibbons was honored as Patriot League Coach of the Year for the second time.

The 2002-2003 team compiled a 13-1 mark in Patriot League play (24-8 overall), earning its seventh-consecutive Patriot League regular season title. Gibbons was again named as the Patriot League Coach of the Year.

After a disappointing 13-15 mark in 2003-2004, the first sub-.500 season under Gibbons' direction, the Crusaders came back to win 20 games in 2004-2005, while capturing both the Patriot League regular season (12-2) and tournament titles, and earning the program's 11th trip to the NCAA Tournament.

The 2005-2006 team (16-14 overall) compiled a 10-4 record in Patriot League play and won six of its last seven games going into the Patriot League championship game, but fell to Army, 69-68 in the title contest, denying the program its 10th postseason appearance in 12 years.

The 2006-2007 team (15-18 overall) finished third in the Patriot League but won the Patriot League Tournament title after defeating No. 4 seed American 56-48 in the final. The Crusaders lost to Duke in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

During the 2007-2008 season (19-13 overall) the Crusaders finished the season ranked second in the league with a 10-4 record and runner-up in the tournament, after hosting Bucknell in the Championship game.

More recently, Gibbons' teams have posted winning records in four of the last eight seasons, while making four more appearances in the Patriot League championship game (2008, 2012, 2013 and 2014). The 2012 team also advanced to the Women's Basketball Invitational, defeating New Hampshire 63-59 in the first round for only the second postseason win in the program's history.
